




EDITOR'S DESK


Community Helpers

the JSS Premier League,2023 - 2024. As usual, the P.E Department had made this



'SPIDER-MAN: ACROSS THE SPIDER-VERSE' VS 'THE FLASH': WHO IS WINNING BOX-OFFICE BATTLE?

In a surprising upset, "Spider-Man: Across the

Spider-Verse" secured the top spot in its fourth weekend with \$19.3 million, crossing the \$300 million mark domestically. However, DC's "The Flash" faced a disastrous decline of 72% with \$15.3 million, totaling \$87.6 million domestically. "No Hard Feelings" opened to \$15.1 million, surpassing expectations.

For "The Flash," this catastrophic performance with a \$200 million budget signals that ticket sales won't rebound during its theatrical run. Thus far, it has only amassed a meager \$67 million at the domestic box office, falling short of the film's projected debut earnings.

In the midst of this chaos, Sony's "Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse" reclaims the top spot at the box office (in its fourth weekend, no less) with an impressive \$19.3 million.





NIALL HORAN'S NEW ALBUM- THE SNOW

Zayn Malik struck gold with "I Don't Wanna Live Forever" in 2017. Harry Styles spent all of 2022 in the limelight thanks to various hit songs on a hit album called Harry's House. Now, it's time for another former One Direction member to shine: Niall Horan.

Horan will be releasing his third studio album, The Show, also on June 9. It's his first album in 3 years since his 2020 project Heartbreak Weather; an album he was never able to properly promote or tour due to the COVID-19 pandemic. So far, he's released the singles "Heaven" and "Meltdown." He's said, "What makes this record incredibly special to me is it's a reflection of where I am in my life today, as a person, a musician, and of course, as a songwriter. Can't say I'm not a little nervous, but hopefully, you'll still like this version of me when you listen to the new record.







PAKISTAN FOOTBALL OFFICIAL SAYS THE INDIA-PAKISTAN GAME COULD BE A TURNING POINT FOR SPORTS

On June 21, the football teams of India and Pakistan faced each other for the first time since 2014. The match took place in Bangalore as part of the SAFF Championship 2023. India, at 101 in the FIFA rankings and led by Sunil Chhetri, thrashed their opponents, ranked 195, 4–0. Chhetri was in his element as he often is, netting a hat-trick.

Haroon Malik, the leader of the committee overseeing the Pakistan Football Federation, expressed optimism about the future of Indo-Pak sport. "It could be a turning point. Football unites the world, and we need to enjoy playing each other and have fun. The emotion of playing India is always special," Malik said.





DENVER NUGGETS TAKE HOME FIRST NBA CHAMPIONSHIP WITH 94-89 WIN AGAINST MIAMI HEAT

The Nuggets outlasted the Miami Heat 94–89 in an ugly, frantic Game 5 that did nothing to derail Nikola Jokic, who bailed out his teammates with 28 points and 16 rebounds on a night when nothing else seemed to work.

Jokic won the Bill Russell trophy as the NBA Finals MVP — an award that certainly has more meaning to him than the two overall MVPs he won in 2021 and '22.

"We are not in it for ourselves, we are in it for the guy next to us," Jokic said. "And that's why this (means) even more."

"It was ugly and we couldn't make shots, but at the end we figured it out," Jokic said. "I am just happy we won the game.".

Cinnamon Rolls

Prep: 40 min Cook: 40 min Serves: 12

kcal: 415

Ingredients

- 500g strong white bread flour
- 7g sachet dried yeast
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 50g golden caster sugar
- 200ml warm milk
- 2 eggs
- 225g butter
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 150g light brown soft sugar
- 2 tbsp ground cinnamon
- 50g soft cheese
- 50g icing sugar
- ¼ tsp vanilla extract

Method

Tip all the ingredients for the dough, except the butter and golden syrup, into the bowl of a stand mixer with 1 tsp salt. Use a paddle attachment to combine everything until it begins to come together into a dough, then tip out onto a floured surface and knead until smooth, about 2 mins. Put it back in the bowl and gradually add the softened butter, 1-2 tsp at a time, while mixing on a medium setting. Alternatively, knead the butter in by hand until smooth. Flatten the dough to a square roughly 20 x 20cm, then cover and freeze for 30 mins, or chill for at least 1 hr.

Meanwhile, butter and line the base and sides of a deep baking tray, roughly 20 x 30cm. To make the filling, mix the sugar with the cinnamon and a large pinch of sea salt, then set aside 2 tbsp. Beat in the butter to form a thick paste.

Lay the dough on a floured surface and roll to a neat rectangle roughly 35 x 25cm. Spread over the filling so it's completely covered. Fold the bottom third of the dough into the middle, then fold over again to cover the top third. For the best results, chill the dough again for another 30 mins.

Re-roll the dough to another rectangle about 40 x 30cm, then roll it up along the long edge into a tight log. To get the neatest spirals, cut in half, lift onto a tray and freeze for 15 mins to firm up, then cut into 12 equal-sized slices. Arrange the slices, spiral side-up, in the tin. Leave to prove in fridge for at least 1 hr, or up to 24 hrs.

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Bake the buns for 20 mins, then scatter over the reserved cinnamon sugar and bake for 10-15 mins until deep brown.

Meanwhile, mix the golden syrup with 2 tsp boiling water. As soon as the buns come out of the oven, brush them with the syrup glaze, then leave to cool a little. To make the icing, beat the soft cheese, icing sugar and vanilla together, then gradually add 1-2 tbsp boiling water to create a thick but pourable consistency. Drizzle the icing over the buns.



Chill & Grill



Grilled Pizza

Prep: 10 min Cook: 15 min Serves: 2 kcal: 615

Ingredients

- 8 oz. pizza dough
- Extra-virgin olive oil, for brushing and drizzling
- 1/2 lb. thinly sliced mozzarella
- 1 large tomato, thinly sliced
- 1 c. cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 c. ricotta
- Freshly chopped basil, for serving
- Pinch of crushed red pepper flakes

Method

Heat grill over medium-high heat. Divide pizza dough into 2 balls and use your hands to stretch out into a circle that's 8" wide. Brush both sides with oil, then place directly on grill grates. Cook until bottom is golden, 1 to 2 minutes, then flip. Immediately top crust with half the cheese, tomatoes, and ricotta, and continue cooking until bottom of pizza is golden, about another minute. Repeat with remaining dough.

Top with basil, red pepper flakes, and a drizzle of oil.

Strawberry Cake

Prep: 10 min Cook: 45 min Serves: 6-8 kcal: 515

Ingredients

- 11/4 c. all-purpose flour
- 1/4 c. cornmeal
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/4 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 c. unsalted butter, plus more for greasing the pan
- 1 c. packed light brown sugar
- 1 large egg
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1/3 c. buttermilk
- 1/2 lb. small strawberries, hulled and halved
- 2 tbsp. turbinado sugar (optional)
- Powdered sugar, for serving
- · Sliced strawberries, for serving

Method

- Stir together the flour, cornmeal, baking powder, baking soda, and salt in a medium bowl. Set aside.
- Preheat the oven to 350°. Butter a 9-inch deep dish pie plate, and set it aside.

 Beat 1/2 cup butter and brown sugar until fluffy, about 3 minutes. Add the egg and vanilla, and beat until just combined. Add half of the flour mixture, the buttermilk, then the remaining flour, beating until combined after each addition.
- Spoon the batter into the prepared pie plate; spread in an even layer using the back of a spoon or a spatula. Scatter the berries evenly over the top of the batter; do not press them down. Sprinkle the berries and batter with 2 tablespoons turbinado sugar, if using.
- Bake until the top is golden brown and a wooden pick inserted into the cake comes out clean, 40 to 45 minutes. Let cool before dusting with powdered sugar and serving with more sliced strawberries, if you like.

Cool Quencher



Snow Cones

Prep: 30 min

Serves: 6-8 kcal: 90

Total: 30 min

Ingredients

- 2 cups (10oz/300g) ice
- 1 cup (5oz/150g) raspberries (frozen or fresh)
- 1 cup (5oz/150g) mango (frozen or fresh)
- 1 cup (5oz/150g) blueberries (frozen or fresh)
- 1 cup (5oz/150g) pineapple (frozen or fresh)
- 2-3 tablespoons sugar per fruit (depending on the sweetness of your fruit)

Method

- In a medium saucepan combine the sugar and fruit.
 Simmer until the fruit has softened and the sugar dissolved, roughly 3-4 minutes.
- Transfer your fruit mixture to a food processor and blend the fruit into a smooth puree. If you don't have a processor try passing it through a fine sieve.

 Once pureed strain over a bowl to remove any seeds or bits from the fruit. If you find the syrup a bit too thick at this stage thin it out with some juice or a little water. Store the syrups in the fridge for up to 7 days.
- Place ice cubes in a blender and pulse to create fine shaved ice. Store in the freezer if you are not using it straight away.


 Scoop your shaved ice into serving dish of your choice and pack it tight together. Pour over your fruit syrup and enjoy immediately!
- To make a rainbow snow cone, pour your individual flavors into a squirt bottle or jug with a spout. Pour each flavor in a line across a scoop of ice, creating a rainbow effect.






