The English Department of Phase 2 at JSSPS initiated a reading focus meet, celebrating the joy of reading through engaging activities, captivating stories, and exciting adventures.


Aim and objective:

## and strategies were then displayed around the Achieve 3000 tracker in the classroom.






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#### Day 2: Digital Library- Achieve 3000



Students reflected on the activities they engaged in throughout the week based on their reading and wrote down their reflections and takeaways in their notebook.



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
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

### INTERNATIONAL DAY OF CLEAN AIR FOR BLUE SKIES.

The Middle School Environment Committee recently organised a Classroom Plant Activity aimed at creating healthier learning spaces while teaching students the basics of responsibility and plant care. Snake Plants (Sansevieria trifasciata) were chosen for their air-purifying properties, as NASA has shown they can absorb up to 50% of toxins, such as formaldehyde from electronics, in just 24 hours. These plants also help reduce anxiety and respiratory issues, making them ideal for classroom environments. With tremendous support from our supervisor and the head teacher of our committee, seventeen Snake Plants were purchased and distributed among the classrooms, with additional plants given to our Vice Principal, Principal, and Head of Learning.

On Monday, the 9th of September, class marshals, teachers, and the leadership team gathered at the Maker's Hub for the official plant handover. During the event, members of the Environment Committee emphasised the importance of clean air and environmental responsibility.





### **VERBAL ABUSE**


As human beings, we talk a lot. On average, the human being speaks around 16000 words a day. We also hear an approximate of 30000 words a day. Its crazy how we as a civilisation have evolved our language capabilities to such an extent that every one of us hears about 8 words for every 15 words we hear. This is great because it means we are hearing and saying all sorts of things that can benefit humanity and help others. However, not all the things we hear and say are great things. Many of us may say some rude and hurtful comments. Over time we as a species have gotten used to hearing such lines; however, just how bad can the things we say affect others?

Dear readers, I introduce you to verbal abuse. It is a type of emotional abuse where someone uses words to assault, degrade, ridicule, manipulate or negatively impact another person's mental health. It involves belittling behaviour, name-calling, yelling. Some people often get verbally abused without realizing that it's happening. Verbal abuse can take many forms. Condescension is the act of demeaning someone using comments. It is often the most common form of verbal abuse and the most apparent. Giving harsh criticism continuously or blaming someone repeatedly for actions already done are other forms of verbal abuse. Judging and commenting is a subtle form of verbal abuse but is also harmful to the victim. It can cause them to have a negative outlook on their surroundings and the sense that everyone around them is against have them.However, it is essential we identify when we are getting verbally abused. Verbal abuse has a huge impact on our mental health. Firstly, it can cause us to perform poorly in our studies and cause us to be less engaged in school. It causes low self-esteem and a poor self-image.

## **UERBAL ABUSE**

That might sound dramatic but it is the truth. Being repeatedly told you are something, reinforces your mind to that idea introduced by the bully. Over time, you start associating yourself with that idea and your self-image gets destroyed in the process. Even if you have the tolerance of a rock and pretend to be deaf to these things, these small insults can cause cracks that can eventually lead to a worse mental health overall. Verbal abuse can also cause increase in anxiety and social withdrawal.

Bullies often tend to verbally abuse their victim for the same reason people get bullied: control. Verbal abuse is often subtle and it often gives the bully a sense of immense control over the victim. Often times, the victim gets scared of their abuser, do not have the guts to face them, do not feel like talking about what they are facing and feel incredibly isolated. The best way to deal with verbal abuse is to immediately call out the behavior. Even if the bully pretends to be your friend or plays it all off as a joke, you should have the guts to immediately call out this behavior in front of them to make your stand. Setting boundaries can allow you to get less exposed to what the bully says about you which can improve your mental health overall. It is often advised to end the relationship if it gets too bad. And if things are not improving, you can always ask help from elders. Verbal abuse may not seem serious in this era where people give comments every time, but it is important we know what our comments can do to others. That way we can learn to be better people and thus create a better world where verbal abuse is a thing of the past.



## **LOLITA** DISTURBING CONTROVERSY OR LITERARY MASTERPIECE

It's interesting how one book can elicit so many different reactions. Lolita, by Vladimir Nabokov is an infamous classic known for dealing with a controversial topic - paedophilia. This book elicited various interesting reactions from whoever I mentioned it to. I was met with various reactions, from recognition ("oh, it's that book") to curiosity to extreme disgust.

This was the initial reason I started reading this book. How often is that you see so many controversial, heated opinions, all for one book? This was about to be a wild ride.

I was aware of the story before I started, of course. To put it plainly, the book is written from the point of view of a pedophile, chronicling his life with the object of his obsession, the lovely twelve year old nymphet, Dolores (or Lolita, as he affectionately calls her).

The story follows Humbert Humbert, a middle-aged literature professor who becomes obsessed with 12-year-old Dolores Haze, whom he calls Lolita. After marrying her mother, Charlotte, to stay close to Lolita, Humbert's obsession leads to a sexual relationship with the girl.


Their tumultuous journey across America is marked by Humbert's possessiveness and manipulation. After Charlotte's accidental death, Humbert takes control of Lolita's life, but she eventually escapes with playwright Clare Quilty. Years later, Humbert finds Lolita as a teenager and learns about her troubled life before murdering Quilty in a fit of rage.

## **LOLITA** DISTURBING CONTROVERSY OR LITERARY MASTERPIECE

The prose was extremely well written and extremely humorous. Every word Nabokov writes has a definite meaning, a definitive point he wants to put across. If the plot of the book didn't pull you in, the prose most definitely will. However, the prose can also get a bit tedious at times, making this a slightly hard book to digest. The story progressed at a medium pace.

In my opinion, the book deserves the fame and attention it still gets, to this day. The ability to weave such a controversial topic into some of the most beautiful prose definitely contributes to the appeal. The real reason this book is so good is how we see Dolores finally Humbert's clutches at the end. Humbert, despite meticulously and cunningly planning everything through to the end, has Lolita escape from his grasp to live a life of her own.




## SCHOOLS SUSTAINABILITY COMPETITION AT DUBAI SAFARI PARK
