Subject:- Assessment scheme for declaration of results of Class XII in West Asian Countries

1. BACKGROUND

Due to the prevailing extraordinary circumstances in West Asian countries (Bahrain, Iran, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the UAE), conducting Class XII Board Examinations as scheduled had become infeasible. In line with its commitment to ensuring student welfare and educational security, CBSE had taken the following decisions vide circular no. CBSE/CE/SPPS/2026/2 dated 13th March, 2026 to support learners affected by ongoing international geopolitical challenges:-

- All examinations of Class XII scheduled from 16.03.2026 to 10.04.2026 stand cancelled.
- Examinations which were earlier postponed vide circular dated 01.03.2026, 03.03.2026, 05.03.2026, 07.03.2026 and 09.03.2026 shall also stand cancelled.

It was also informed that the mode of declaration of results for Class XII candidates in these countries will be notified separately in due course.

2. PREPARATION OF AN OBJECTIVE ASSESSMENT SCHEME

Board examinations for Class XII were scheduled from 17.02.2026 to 10.04.2026. Examinations scheduled up to 28.02.2026 were conducted successfully before conducting examinations became infeasible:-

Ensuring the declaration of valid, reliable, fair, and unbiased results for students under the present circumstances is an exceptionally challenging task. Any results derived through approximation methods cannot fully match those produced from an actual examination. Nevertheless, the assessment policy must uphold the principles of fairness, reliability, validity, impartiality, and transparency for all students. It should also be procedurally sound, drawing upon adequate, credible, and dependable information about students' performance. Only then can the policyenable objective and precise conclusions regarding the achievement of individual students.

This is to inform you that as per the latest notification issued by CBSE dated **27 March 2026**, an **Alternative Assessment Scheme** has been introduced for the declaration of **Class XII results** for students in West Asian countries, including the UAE, due to prevailing extraordinary circumstances.

The key directives are as follows:

1. Background

- Due to the ongoing geopolitical situation in West Asian countries (including UAE), conducting examinations became infeasible.
- As per earlier CBSE circulars:
 - All examinations scheduled from **16 March 2026 to 10 April 2026 stand cancelled**.
 - Previously postponed examinations (dated 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 9th March 2026) are also cancelled.

2. Conduct of Examinations (Status)

- Board exams were originally scheduled from **17 February to 10 April 2026**.
- Examinations conducted successfully up to **28 February 2026** will be considered.

3. Principles of Assessment

CBSE will ensure that the assessment process remains:

- Fair and unbiased
- Reliable and valid
- Transparent
- Based on credible academic data

4. Categories of Students Identified

Students have been categorized based on the number of examinations completed:

- Appeared in all subjects
- Appeared in 4, 3, 2, or 1 subject(s)
- Students with all 5 or 6 exams pending
- Compartment candidates (2025 or earlier – 1 subject)

5. Components of Assessment

Each subject carries **100 marks**, divided into:

- **Theory Examination** (conducted by CBSE)
- **Practical/Internal Assessment (IA)** (conducted by school)

Marks distribution varies across subjects (e.g., 80:20, 70:30, 60:40, 50:50, 30:70).

- **Internal Assessment/Practical marks remain unchanged**, as these have already been completed and uploaded.

6. Alternative Assessment Policy

(a) Students who appeared in all subjects

- Result will be based entirely on their **actual board examination performance**.

(b) Students with pending examinations (1–6 subjects)

General Rule:

- Assessment will be based on **school-based evaluations** and theory weightage.

For subjects with 80 or 70 marks (Theory):

- Marks will be taken from:
 - Quarterly exam
 - Half-Yearly exam
 - Final Pre-Board exam
- **Best of the three** will be considered.

For subjects with 60, 50, or 30 marks (Theory):

- Marks will be taken from **Final Pre-Board Examination**.
- If absent in final pre-board → earlier pre-board marks will be used.
- Schools must upload these marks on the CBSE portal.

(c) Board Discretion

- CBSE may take any additional decision, if required, for fair result declaration.

7. Declaration of Results

- Results will be declared **along with other CBSE students globally**.

We understand that this is an unusual situation, and we assure you that the school is working closely with CBSE guidelines to ensure that every student's academic interests are safeguarded.

We request parents to remain assured and extend their continued support.
